Letter From Avening Parish Council Leader



Sometimes it's the little things in life that cause immense frustration, or give a sense of achievement greater than is warranted for a simple task. Both of these emotions have been experienced in what should have been a straightforward task to procure a small shed to house the new village grit spreader. The spreader itself was delivered to me without drama back in March, and has subsequently lain unloved amongst builders' material and nettles in our front garden. The shed however was a different story. Ordered at the same time, the first unit arrived on time, but was completely the wrong size. After many phone calls by our project manager, the supplier eventually admitted responsibility and agreed a replacement. Skip forward another four months, and many more chasers, and the correct shed is finally in place, allowing me to finally get the gritter into its rightful home. The story is a metaphor for many suppliers in the building industry – some are excellent, but far too many are absolutely abject!

The push along machine itself will be stored outside the Memorial Hall (in the area to the left, behind the metal gates) and is available to anyone in the village should we see any of the white stuff (the lock combination will be made available), and is much more efficient at spreading the correct amount of salt on pavements and untreated local roads than with a shovel.

A member of our community was involved in a freak accident while on holiday in Cyprus earlier this year, and suffered catastrophic injuries to his neck leaving him severely physically disabled. He is currently in hospital in Salisbury, and unable to return home to his young family in Avening until their house has been modified to accommodate his needs. A charity, Best for Ben, has been set up to help raise funds for the work needed, and the story has even made the national press. With a combination of cash donations, and offers of help on the ground, everyone is hoping to get Ben home soon. A Facebook page has been set up to share information on progress.

If anyone can identify a rogue dog owner who seems to take a route through Sandford Leaze to the playing field, the residents would be grateful. The dog would appear to be a large one, and leaves very distinctive (and particularly gross) orange deposits. Once identified, the owner will receive a visit from the authorities, and hopefully a large fine, as they show complete disregard for everyone else in the neighbourhood, and give other responsible owners a bad name. Please let me or the clerk know if you have any information.

Letter from Rev. Poppy Hughes



Dear Friends,

This is a difficult letter to write. As announced in a letter from Bishop Rachel last Sunday, I am in fact standing down from my ministry as Rector here in Avening and Cherington to concentrate on my responsibilities in the Tetbury benefice.

This has been a very hard decision for me, as I have loved getting to know the churches and people of Avening and Cherington. I am grateful for the welcome and support I have been given over the past two and a half years, with particular thanks going to the Church Wardens: Stephanie Hamilton and Stephen Uzzell in Avening, and Roger Gegg and John Bate-Williams in Cherington, however, being responsible for two Benefices with six parishes was sadly not sustainable. I knew something had to give, and I am just sorry that it was my ministry here.

As Bishop Rachel explained, the Archdeacon will now meet with the Parochial Church Councils (PCCs) for the Benefice in early October, and she expects an advertisement for a new House for Duty priest to take responsibility for the Benefice to be placed shortly after that.

Bishop Rachel went on: "I am aware that this news will come as a surprise to many of you and I will be praying that amidst any sense of uncertainty and change that you will know the unchanging love and faithfulness of God. I want to assure you of my support and to encourage you to look with confidence to the future."

Of course, until a new priest is appointed it is the wardens with the support of the Area Dean who have the responsibility for the parish.

Please be assured you are in my thoughts and prayers.

Crayfish deaths in watercourses in our area, and increased biosecurity

The Environment Agency is investigating the deaths of our rare protected native white clawed Crayfish in three locations across the Severn and Wye river catchment. We expect this to be confirmed as Crayfish Plague which is very infectious for Crayfish.



White clawed Crayfish look like miniature lobsters. They hide away under rocks and logs during the day, and emerge during the night to eat. They are our largest freshwater invertebrate and the few remaining populations are very vulnerable to this disease and face local extinction. Crayfish Plague is a species specific disease and has no implications for human or other animal health

Dead white clawed Crayfish have been seen in the several catchments, including Nailsworth Stream, Gloucestershire.

White Clawed Crayfish may be infected, but apparently healthy, and continue to die for several weeks in these locations. As a result an outbreak of Crayfish Plague can last for several weeks. The disease can be transferred to White Clawed Crayfish via water and mud on damp clothes, footwear, bike tyres, fishing or boating equipment or any machinery. The Crayfish Plague pathogens can live for 22 days on damp clothes or equipment.

The public are being asked to stay out of watercourses in affected areas. If you are using equipment in any river, please follow these steps to stop the spread of the Plague:

- Clean off any mud or vegetation and remove any standing water.
- Either thoroughly dry the equipment, preferably in sunlight making sure all nooks and crannies are dry **OR**
- Treat with a disinfectant capable of killing fungal spores.

If you or your dog goes into a stream, do not go into another stream on the same day.

If you see dead Crayfish or an environmental incident please phone **0800 80 70 60**.

Please do not handle or remove live or dead Crayfish. It is **illegal** to do this without a license.

Letters to the Editors

One day this month I was delighted to receive a telephone call from Sylvia Fletcher (nee Stone), who is a regular reader of The Villager. The call had been prompted by Sylvia reading the article in last month's edition about Joseph Rowland.

Sylvia, who will celebrate her 90th birthday in December, was a resident of Avening for most of her life and only moved away in 1987 to help care for her grandchildren. She now lives in Ashton Keynes, but says that her 'heart will always be in Avening'. It was particularly lucky for me that it was our number that she rang to share her excited recollections with, since they centred on the house in which Dominic and I now live, Church Farm.

Sylvia wondered if the Joseph Rowland discussed was any relation of the Rowlands who had lived at Church Farm, when she was a child. She lived with her family in the cottage, then thatched, at the entrance to Avening Park. Later she moved to one of the neighbouring cottages. As a young child, in the 1930s, she remembers coming to the farm to buy eggs and butter on a Thursday and daily for the milk, which was collected in an enamel can. She remembers our kitchen as the dairy, which had a 'lovely' stone flagged floor. Following the Rowlands, the Blackwells moved into the farm. After they left, the Lauries lived for some years here and Sylvia particularly recalls the delicious clotted cream that Mrs Laurie made.

Sylvia obviously has lots more to tell us about the village and I hope that she may be able to call, when she is next in Avening to lay flowers on the graves of her family members, so that she can share some of those memories with us. In any case I am sure that all our readers will join me in wishing her a very happy 90th birthday.

Stone Circles, Coal mines and School Elections.....

.....all in the first month back at School!

What a busy start to the new school year it has been with term topics well under way, three school trips already taken place and a school election held to decide the new members of our School Council.

We also have a whole new reception class in the Eagles who are settling in wonderfully and have been enjoying their first few weeks of school.

Our term topics throughout the School have taken on a similar historical theme with the Owls (y5/6) and Kestrels (y1/2) both focusing on local history and industry. The Kestrels are learning 'all about Avening' and will be experimenting with felt making as well as taking a trip to some of the local mills. The Owls have already been down a coalmine, sat in a Victorian classroom and experienced the daily walk of a Victorian child worker walking from Avening to Nailsworth in their study of local Industry

The Hawks (y3/4) have gone back a lot further, to the 'Savage Stone Age' paying a visit to Avebury Stone Circles last month as well as having an archaeological dig in the school grounds.

Extra curricular activities have also begun with a return of old favourites such as football club and drawing class and some brand new additions to the line up, include computing and photography clubs.



It's that time of the year again, with Young Voices only months away (January 2017), so the words have been distributed and the moves are being rehearsed. Next year's concert promises to be as amazing as the last with an eclectic mix of songs covering rock, pop and traditional ballads.

We are pleased to be taking part in the Schools Direct programme, as part of the Cotswold Edge Teaching Alliance (CETA). We will be looking to interview prospective PGCE candidates in the near future, with a view to a placement in our school next academic year.





Down to Earth

Today we have picnic tables and benches; in Elizabethan times, and until well into the 1800s, there were banqueting houses. The word 'banquet' derives from the French, 'banc' and the Italian, 'banco' and its diminutive, 'banchetto', meaning a domestic bench. The 'banquet' was an informal meal, comprising sweetmeats such as: marzipans, jellies, quince cakes and gingerbread. As a dessert to the main meal, the banquet was taken in a separate room, which could be a roof turret.

At Lacock Abbey (NT), Sir William Sharrington built an octagonal tower in around 1550, in which there were two banqueting rooms (according to respected historian Mark Girouard), one accessed through the main house, the other, above it, across the roof. Sir John Thynne, visiting Lacock in the 1560s, was so impressed that on his return his house at Longleat positively sprouted roof-top banqueting houses, both octagonal and square! Two other examples of outstanding, local banqueting houses are the Dutch-style Tall Pavilion at Westbury Court Garden (NT) at one end of the canal, designed by Maynard Colchester 1, and Badminton's Worcester Lodge, by William Kent. And both of these have the important added feature of a particular vista or a view.

Not all banqueting houses adjoined great country houses. We recently visited The Kymin (NT), on a hill-top east of Monmouth. In the 1790s, a group of 'the principal Gentlemen of Monmouth and its vicinity' were accustomed to meet, walk, frequently to the top of the Kymin hill, and dine together, on a Tuesday. 'The Dinner, which is provided by each member in his turn, consists of a cold collation; a desert of fruits, with wine and other liquors to a certain limitation.' (I do love that 'to a certain limitation'!) When one member proposed the erection of 'a slight building ... as a security from the inclemency of the weather' there was no shortage of Gentlemen and their friends who pledged

their guinea, until 80 guineas were raised and on May 1st 1794 the foundation stone was laid. And thus the round, castellated banqueting house on The Kymin came into being.

On a recent trip to coastal Cornwall, we were struck by the sight of the nodding flame-coloured flowers of the montbretia (or crocosmia x crocosmiiflora) speckling roadside verges and banks. A native wild-flower?

Surely not. A garden escapee, then. Montbretia hail from Africa but are reliably frost hardy. In the herbaceous border, they are excellent for flamboyant, late-summer pizzazz, especially the cultivars 'Lucifer' (deep scarlet) and 'Emily MacKenzie' (deep orange with crimson markings.) They grow from small, round, underground corms, which have the extraordinary habit of piling on top of one another with the newest on top. Their one problem is that an established clump grows congested (too many underground vertical columns of corms!) and the plant sulks, grows leaves in abundance but no flowers. Solution? Replant the newest, top corms. Some books refer to montbretia as an invasive species. Given the regenerative capacity of these little corms it is easy to see how they 'leap't the fence' and made off into the wild.

If you haven't already discovered Derry Watkins and her nursery of 'Special Plants' near Marshfield, just north of Bath, I think you're missing something. She is a real, hands-on plantswoman extraordinaire: a madcap enthusiast. The garden is open every Tuesday between March and October, 'Special Tuesdays', and Derry gives a short, topical talk. She is engagingly 'down to earth'. We visited when the garden was at its late summer peak. I marvelled at the lush, abundant growth on the exposed but south-facing slope while my Assistant Gardener studied the walling and other built features created by Derry's architect husband.

Back in the garden, it is that glorious season of gathering in the goodies and rejoicing in that rich, golden light of autumn with its attendant mists and magic. When the fleshy pods of the climbing beans are no longer palatable, I take out the beans, blanch and freeze them. They are an excellent source of fibre and protein in stews, soups and casseroles. My tomatoes broke all records this year, not least the Italian variety, Pomodoro Cuor di Bue (Beef heart tomato) from Franchi Seeds of Italy. Several weighed in at 500g, with no reduction in flavour!

Parking in Lawrence Road

It is clear that the current position is untenable, and will result in damage, injury, or worse. So, for this reason we are calling all responsible agencies together for a site meeting at the earliest possible time in order to agree an appropriate and cost effective solution as soon as possible.


