Letter From Avening Parish Council Leader



Mark it in your diary – 20th May! On a restless night a couple of weeks ago (sorry Mandy!), I was pondering what we could do to make our annual village meeting a bit different, and a bit special. We already have two excellent summer fetes, so we don't need another. The Queen doesn't have a special birthday, so a tea party didn't seem quite right. After more tossing and turning, I thought that animals are always popular, but how could we incorporate them into an event? Then the Eureka moment! We are a rural community with people who love the countryside, and are surrounded by farms and small holdings – we could have a **country show!** The PC team are all equally passionate in wanting to bring the village together, and it was agreed - on May 20th Avening will have its very first (small) country show. Details to follow next month.

Crime in Avening is thankfully very low, and our area PCSOs have played a big part in keeping us safe, so it is with great sadness we hear that Paul Hancock is moving on, having been asked to cover a new area. He will not be replaced, and the PC is writing to the Police Commissioner to protest – with higher tax income, but greater risk from the huge developments in Tetbury, we do not think it is acceptable to lose this valuable resource.

Cotswold villages weren't designed to cater for the ever increasing number and size of cars that we have today. It is not uncommon for a family household to have 3 or 4 cars, and maybe a works van as well – it's almost impossible for everyone to park outside their own home, especially in terraces. No one has a right to park by their property, and everyone needs to be realistic, but it is also important to recognise the appropriate traffic regulations. For example, you can't park across a drop kerb – this is obstruction. We also have a number of white lines in place for safety – these should also be avoided. There is little scope to get more off street parking, but the PC are working with Bromford and Highways to see if additional spaces can be provided in the Lawrence Rd/Sun Ground area. Ultimately, it's up to everyone to be fair to our neighbours – if you have large/multiple vehicles, perhaps consider parking a little further away to avoid bad feelings.

Don't forget, we need your 'Pride of Avening' awards nominations ASAP – tell any councillor; email, write, or call the clerk:

- Villager of the Year (for anyone aged over 21)
- Student Villager of the Year (for ages 12-21)
- Youth Villager of the Year (11 and under).

Silent Space


A `silent space` is available in Avening church for anyone who wants to take time out to reflect, pray or just `be`.

The Avening Silver Band has been in existence for twenty-eight years.

At the start there were only two men who knew anything about music and they were not instrumentalists; so, on the 27th February, 1927 the twelve instruments which form the nucleus of the present band were placed upon a table and were allocated to twelve volunteers regardless of their shape, size or suitability. That's how it began.

Since then the Band has met with various fortunes and has had to cope with many incidents, both amusing and grave. At one time, when the last instalment on the instruments had been paid, the credit balance in the Band Fund stood at sevenpence halfpenny.

Although matters are not now so acute, the uniforms, which are twenty-six years old, are becoming ragged and worn and it is felt that for the good name of the village they should be replaced.

The Band tries particularly to attract the youth of the village and an interest in music serves to occupy the spare time of many a youngster who might otherwise be getting into mischief.

Will you help us again as you have so generously done in the past? The Band will be playing in the near future in different parts of the village and we feel sure that our collectors will meet with a generous response.



Down to Earth

The progress of spring is marked, like no other season, by the procession of flowers. First the snowdrops, clothed in modesty, emerge to vanquish the harshness of winter; then, while the crocus lifts its face joyfully to reflect the light of the sun, the daffodils dance and trumpet their fanfare. But now is the moment of the flower described by Vita Sackville West: “...the hanging cups of fritillaries, Sullen and foreign-looking, the snaky flower Scarfed in dull purple ...” Yet I think she must have been was seeing them on an overcast day. With the sunlight on them, they are not dull at all but have a diaphanous quality with that exquisitely illuminated inner checkerboard pattern. Again – and I find I am repeating myself – we are very fortunate living here. To the east of Avening, on the outskirts of Cricklade, is North Field, a water-meadow and SSSI, which has a significant natural population of the fritillaria meleagris, or snake's head fritillary. Choose a sunny day to go and see these Tiffany lamps in a field. It is a cold, wind-blasted water meadow and they are not yet showing but when I spoke to a Natural England warden he promised a good display around the beginning of April.

Aside from the snakes' head fritillary, my plant of the month has got to be the corydalis cheilanthifolia, the fern-leaved corydalis. We are probably all accustomed to seeing the yellow corydalis, corydalis lutea, spilling over from cracks in walls and pavings, especially in ancient cities. The blue species,

corydalis flexuosa, is a pretty one and I remember once being struck by how it had colonised the edges of a yew-lined walk descending the hillside at Powis Castle. It flowers in the spring and lies dormant in the summer. Corydalis cheilanthifolia, on the other hand, is an evergreen and quite unlike its yellow and blue relations.

I bought mine at the Minchinhampton WI market, years ago. It has since clumped up and self seeded, proving, if proof were needed, that it is happy in local conditions. I have some in a pot of evergreens close to the house. It looks like a fern, until it begins to flower! *

Now, I've grown vegetables nearly all my adult life, even when there was only myself to feed. OK, I do it in quite a ham-fisted, idiosyncratic, muddle-through, amateurish way, but still, I grow vegetables, we eat them and we're still alive and pretty fit. But if I go into a garden centre and see 'starter kits' and all the paraphernalia for 'grow-it-yourself', I nearly blow a fuse. All cynically aimed at young people and novices. And the cost of it all! Honestly, I believe that older gardeners like myself should regard it as a duty to help younger people starting out with a garden. We all have plants to spare at some time or other: a division of something that's grown too big for its space, a self-seeded progeny, too many young cabbage plants, some spare tomato plants. Besides, doesn't everybody like to give advice, impart their wisdom? It's just plain wrong that young adults should be lured into spending their scant financial resources on things like 'starter kits'. Can't we start them off, with a few plants, seeds or seedlings – and advice laced with common sense?

At this time of year, I am dealing brutally with plants - now I'm talking herbaceous perennials – that have got up too close and personal with their neighbour. If you don't give plants their space now, they'll be battling it out for Lebensraum come mid to late summer. And, although it's a bore to do this, it's really a piece of the vigorous (and how!) new growth on the outside that should be replanted. This is particularly the case with crocosmia, asters, lysimachia ciliata, persicaria (bistort) and the common pink geranium. (So if you see a lot of these on the plant stall – you know it's because they SPREAD!)

* I have potted up three of these plants. They are in good health and flowering now - and are destined for the plant stall at the village fête!

An Update on Ben Wernham

You have probably heard the fantastic news that the BBC one television programme DIY SOS have agreed to help with the build at Ben and Ella's house. This is fantastic news because it now means that Ben has a date he can return home to Avening to be with Ella and his girls.

The building work to the house consists of two extensions; one at the side of the property to accommodate Ben's bedroom, a wet room and another bedroom for a live-in carer. Above Ben's room will be an office with a through floor lift so Ben will be able to come up to the second floor again. The rear extension (1 room, 2 storey) will allow for the whole house to be re-configured enabling Ben to get into every room and move around freely. It is only possible for DIY SOS to build the side extension for Ben so the money raised through Best for Ben has enabled us to cover the costs for the groundworks for both extensions and to build the rear extension ready for DIY SOS to come and knock through and get the rest of the house opened up and decorated. We are so lucky to have DIY SOS on board! The ramp at the front of the house is kindly being done for free at weekends by Lines Construction who are doing the groundworks out the back (+some very lovely volunteers from the community).

The initial estimate for the building work was in the region of £240,000 and when the committee sat down to discuss fundraising in June last year, it just seemed such an unachievable task. But with a dedicated committee several fundraising events were planned. Offers of help came in thick and fast, both with events and labour for the build and we have just gone over the £100,000 mark. Ella really had to justify raising so much money to stay in their family home – even with adding the build total onto the house value, there was no way of finding a property to accommodate Ben's new needs in Avening or the surrounding villages. Finding a property that is already set up for a Tetraplegic and his family is just a no-go. The family would've had to move out of the community (and adapt another place) leaving the support network that's so vitally needed behind.

At the beginning of March, Ben left the spinal unit in Salisbury hospital and moved to a care centre in Gloucester, where he will learn to be more independent. Unbelievably, an injury as severe as Ben's does not automatically mean that you are entitled to a fit-for-purpose wheel chair and he was released from Salisbury with a manual wheel chair that he could not actually move or sit in comfortably as it had no support. Luckily because of the funds Best for Ben have raised, we were able to get a new chair on order for him, at a cost of £9,500, and although the new chair will not be ready for some time, the

company who are manufacturing it for him have been kind enough to lend him a chair so he can continue to get around.

The groundworks and footings for both extensions are already well underway with almost all outside space being dug up or disturbed in some form or another. Groundworks alone were estimated at between £50-70K.

Fundraising will continue for the foreseeable future to cover the building work costs, and to provide the necessary equipment and care that Ben needs going forward. Another unbelievable fact is that Ben is now only being offered one physiotherapy session every six months so funding private physiotherapy sessions will be a priority.

Recently Egypt Mill donated a free evening and supper for 100 people so we held a quiz with an Elvis tribute act, this raised £1,600. Matt and Jonny from the committee ran 54 miles from Salisbury back to Avening in 1 day raising over £4,500, and by the time this magazine goes to print Avening WI will have kindly held a quiz to raise more funds.

The Best for Ben committee meet regularly and our February meeting was held with Ben in Salisbury hospital.

Ben, Ella and everyone in the Best for Ben committee would like to thank you all for your continued support. The help and kindness from everyone in Avening has been unbelievable and we would not be at this point in the process without you all. Thank you!!




