Some of the bins got refilled at the last snowfall, but the Council needs to find a storage area and order supplies during the summer. Cllr Hamilton remarked that the salt bin at New Inn Lane was empty and also broken. The Clerk will request that it is filled but it is the Parish Councils responsibility to replace broken bins.
 - It was noted that there had been some over use of the salt and salt being used on private land. The Parish Council agreed to explore a storage area for next winter.
