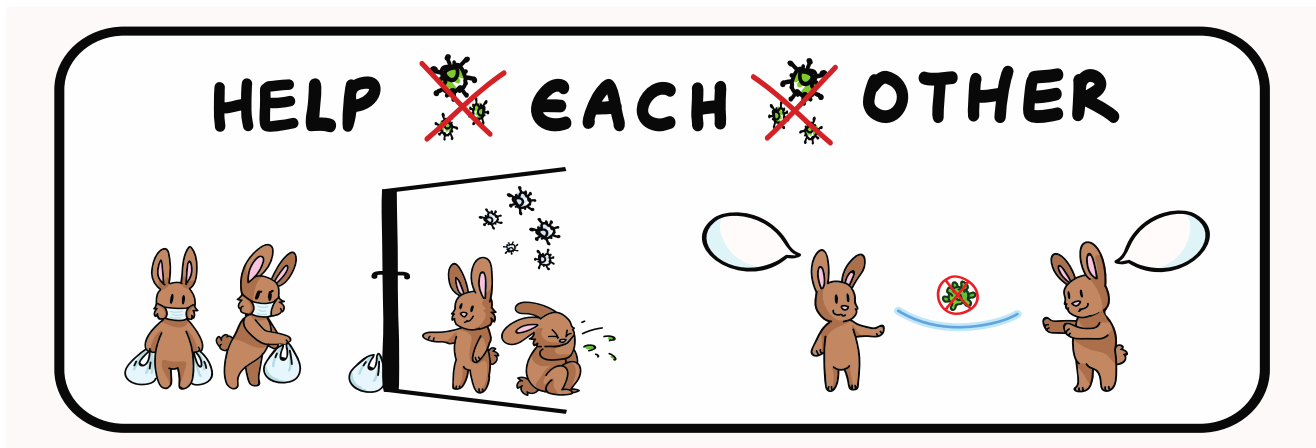


# The Avening Community Coronavirus Team



## Neighbourhood Network Newsletter #2



Hello!

Welcome to our second Neighbourhood Network Newsletter – we're so glad you found the first one helpful. Our sense is that while we're all adapting to this 'new normal', there are still plenty of leftfield challenges being thrown at us.....trying to find a late-night pharmacy for example, or dealing remotely with an online scam targeting your 89-year old father! But there is also plenty of good stuff going on around the village to make living in lockdown more bearable, which we wanted to share here.

There are so many ways that people in the village are helping each other. From the network of volunteers to numerous individual initiatives. **Sandra Hettlerley** baked cupcakes for the children and teachers who remain in school over the holidays, who in turn allow key frontline workers to work; **Pete Barton** began his 'five-a-day' litter pick campaign, which captured imaginations in the village and beyond; and at the request of one of the village's nurses, **Mel Young** put out an SOS for pillow cases which could be turned into laundry bags for NHS workers – and within 48 hours had more than enough to meet demand.

### Around Gloucestershire

Many (but not all) organisations now have specific coronavirus pages on their websites. Gloucester County Council has set up a Community Help Hub, which has a lot of information about local organisations. Please do let us know about other local trainers and studios which have set up online classes – this is a very tough time for them all. They support us to get fit in good times, so we need to support them to survive in tricky ones.

**The Bell** (836422) continues to open for takeaway Indian meals – and keeps one barrel on tap if anyone wants to add a beer (or two). Phone ahead with an order, enter through one door, leave through another and treat yourself to a night out at home. Remember too you can still buy **honey from Ian MacDonald** in Point Road.

**The Avening Community Café** held its first Zoom Café last Tuesday with over a dozen people joining in. We're holding a second Café Zoom next Tuesday so if you'd like a bit of virtual company with your morning cuppa, dial in! ## Information about pharmacies and surgeries

Most pharmacies have special Easter opening times and restricted normal business times. The opening times listed online are often out of date. **Lloyds Nailsworth** (01453 832051) and **Lloyds Tetbury** (01666 503058) open an hour later than usual, close between 1 and 2pm and close an hour earlier than their advertised opening times. **Boots Michinhampton** (01453 882146) is exceptionally busy and also has limited opening hours.

Lloyds runs an **online delivery service** for repeat prescriptions: <https://www.echo.co.uk>. However it is reporting slower than usual delivery times.

Finally, an Avening resident learned the hard way just how difficult it is to find a **late night pharmacy** at the moment. Many online details of late opening hours are inaccurate and it can be hard to get through to these pharmacies on the phone. She did eventually find a pharmacy open, the details of which we are sharing here with a BIG health warning that the information may already be out of date!
