# **District Councillor's Report**



**Cotswold District Council (CDC):** With two O&S meetings and a full council there's a lot to digest from July! The full council was mostly a wider discussion on these items:

Overview & Scrutiny (O&S): The most critical task for CDC is to complete a revised Local Plan to protect against speculative and uncontrolled development. The plan was already in production, but the Government imposition of new housing targets (increased from under 400 to 1,036 per year) means the Cotswold district now only has a 1.8 year supply of housing instead of the previous 5 years required. The main problem in achieving anything like this number is that once the highly protected Cotswold Landscape (formerly AoNB) is taken out, plus other unsuitable areas such as flood plains, there is only 16% of the district available for development. This will focus any strategic developments on to a very small number of communities, which will inevitably lead to objections and legal challenges. O&S recommended several actions for the Cabinet (later accepted), most notably to use appropriate reserve pots to fully resource and fast track production of the plan; and to write to the Secretary of State to argue that the target is unachievable (the letter has now been sent).

We reviewed the financial performance for quarter 3 – there were several areas that had improved since the last review, and others that had deteriorated – notably, the income from car parking was £82,000 down on forecasts. When I queried this shortfall; the response was that CDC had lost its two enforcement officers so there was no income from parking tickets! New wardens are now being employed, so the 'free parking holiday' should now cease. Also down was the forecast income from cemeteries due to 'lower service provision' – arguably a good thing?

It should also be noted that in a written response to my question, there will be no further spending on the Publica transition of resources back to CDC until the outcome of local council reorganisation is known. The planning team are now almost at full capacity, with 80% of applications being dealt with on time, but the Enforcement team are still struggling. They were the subject of a recent peer review and action plan, with several important initiatives to be implemented, including a new triage process, IT improvements, and actively using software already available. These improvements won't immediately help to reduce the 561 outstanding cases, and even new cases are likely to take up to 6 months to be dealt with! This was a pertinent discussion as I had two new urgent planning breaches the same week, one of which broke during the meeting! This will be very frustrating news for all those affected, and O&S recommended to Cabinet that resources be prioritised in this area.

At an earlier full council a motion was proposed to write to the Chancellor Rachel Reeves concerning the imposition of Inheritance Tax (IHT) on farms. The motion was deferred to O&S to investigate the matter in more detail, and what is called a Task & Finish group reported back their recommendations. The result was a very constructive set of options including one to charge Capital Gains Tax on any future sale rather than IHT. This would help protect our essential small farms, but rightly tax speculators trying to avoid IHT on their estates. It would also help to reduce the artificially high price of land, and give

farmers, whose industry average age is 59, a fair opportunity to plan for any future taxes. The recommendations were enthusiastically approved at full council, with the final wording to be agreed. Will we be able to change the Chancellor's mind - probably not, as she didn't even consult with the industry before imposing it, but at least we can show we are constructively supporting our farmers in the Cotswolds.

Avening Stream: For several years we have had issues with water levels in the stream which has completely dried up this summer. I have been working with the Environment Agency (EA) and several water authorities to understand why. A report was commissioned with Wessex Water to study the impact of housing on our underground aquifers, and this will be published in September - I'll provide a summary when it is available, but one headline is that the additional housing in Tetbury is apparently not to blame, their source aquifer runs further down our system around Longford's Mill. This still doesn't answer our issue, and I am continuing to work with the agencies to identify the major causes.

The Cirencester Fire Station roundabout works have been completed! The roundabout on the dual carriageway in Cirencester, closest to the Fire Station, along with the mini roundabout at the junction of Love Lane and Midland Road, underwent a major upgrade to improve traffic capacity and flows, improve safety, and mitigate flooding in the area. A drainage basin has been created in the central island, to mitigate flooding issues. This island was reduced in size to create extra lanes on the roundabout. The existing verges have been reduced to create a three-lane entry from Midland Road onto the main roundabout. Intelligent traffic lights on the main roundabout are operational 24hrs a day, which can detect vehicle levels and react accordingly to improve traffic flow. The two signal-controlled pedestrian crossings have been installed providing safe crossing points for pedestrians and cyclists which are activated by push buttons.

#### **Additional Information**

Community Governance Review (CGR): The District Council has received two formal requests, one from a Parish Council asking to change to a Parish Meeting, and the other requesting an increase in the number of parish councillors. CDC are therefore preparing to undertake a CGR and are inviting all other Parish and Town Councils/Meetings to consider whether there are changes you would like to propose. These can include: Creating, merging, altering, or abolishing parishes; changing the name of a parish; reviewing electoral arrangements (e.g. number of councillors, warding); to reflect local circumstances. PLEASE GET IN TOUCH WITH ME if you would like more information relating to CGRs. The review is expected to take place over the next 9–12 months, with any changes implemented at the ordinary elections in May 2027. Requests should be made to elections@cotswold.gov.uk no later than 30 September 2025.

**Crowdfund:** The latest round of funding is now open, and the Council is encouraging individuals, groups, and organisations to get involved and share their ideas for projects that will benefit their local communities. The deadline to apply is 24 September 2025. If you are interested in raising funds for your own ideas you can get started today by visiting the Crowdfund Cotswold website and creating your own project page.

### Letter from Roz Savage MP



#### **Listening, Learning, and Local Voices**

Over the summer, I've been making the most of the parliamentary recess to get out and about across the South Cotswolds - and what a pleasure it's been. Between 28 July and 28 August, I held 17 'Meet Your MP' events in town halls, village halls and open-air spots in Cirencester and Malmesbury. These informal drop-ins were a fantastic way to meet people where they are - in the heart of their own communities. Whether we chatted in a village hall or on the pavement in the middle of a market, I genuinely valued every conversation. Some came with specific concerns or questions; others just wanted to say hello. All were welcome, and every exchange helped deepen my understanding of what matters most to people in our part of the world.



In Avening, I was especially glad to speak with residents face-to-face. A big thank you to everyone who came along to the Avening Community Cafe on 29 July - your warmth and openness made it a really engaging morning.

There were common threads running through the conversations: access to GPs and dentists, the future of rural transport, housing that local families can afford, and how we support our farmers while protecting the landscapes we love. These are national issues, yes - but they land here in very local ways, and that's where we see the true impact on everyday life.

I also heard uplifting stories - from volunteers running food banks and youth clubs, to local entrepreneurs doing brilliant things with small businesses, to neighbours coming together to tackle loneliness. These are the moments that remind me why I stepped into public life: to help create the conditions where people and communities can thrive.

It's a space where we're sharing local success stories, practical resources, and ideas that can make a real difference - whether you're looking for community funding advice or simply want to be inspired by what's possible.

What I love most about this role is hearing directly from you. I've always said I want to be an MP with the community, not just for it - and that starts with listening, staying curious, and being open to new ideas. These summer conversations have already helped shape my focus as I return to Parliament this autumn - and they'll continue guiding my work back here at home too.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to talk. My team and I are already thinking about how we can do this again soon. In the meantime, I'll keep working hard on your behalf - with care, with purpose, and with hope and optimism for all we can achieve together.

The committee are preparing for more exciting events in the autumn. Firstly helping to keep





# "Man's inhumanity to man makes countless thousands mourn"

So wrote the poet Robert Burns in 1784 and, sadly, it would seem that the world hasn't changed much since he made that comment all those years ago.

But it's when you hear, as I did the other day, of the kindness of a complete stranger, then you realise that goodness and kindness do still exist in the world. This particular incident happened to a friend of mine who lives some distance away. She called me and said "My faith in humanity has just been restored - I've just got to tell you the most amazing thing that happened to me yesterday" were her opening words.

She and her husband had been away for a few days and as they were on their way home she realised that she needed to stock up the larder so as they were passing a small supermarket she got her husband to drop her off while he went off to hopefully find a fuel station. She got to the till with quite a large basket of food, packed it into a couple of carrier bags and then, to her total embarrassment realised she had left her purse and card in the car and had no way of paying. She started to apologise to the person on the checkout till, when a man who she'd obviously never seen before in her life, said "Don't worry-I'll deal with your payment" and promptly paid for the contents of my friend's basket. He refused to give her any details as to who he was or any means of paying him what she owed and as he walked off with his own trolley he just said "You can put it down to my good deed for the day" and was gone. As she followed him out of the supermarket she was desperately hoping her husband might be waiting in the car park but not a sign of him. Her gallant gentleman got into his car, gave her a cheery wave and drove off.

As my friend said her faith in humanity, not surprisingly, had been restored.

And it's not only kindness to our fellow human beings that is so important - to end on a very different and very simple note.

I'd just started out on a walk with my dog when I saw her sniffing rather hard at something on the ground. It was, in fact, a coal tit lying with its wings spread-eagled and seemingly unable to fly. I put it in the palm of my hand where it settled down. I could feel its little heart beating - which was a good sign - and even better when it closed its eyes and went off to sleep so, as I didn't want to abandon it on the ground, it came for a walk with us. Every so often it would give a little flutter but had no intention of leaving its new little safe resting place even to the point of digging its little claws into my hand as if to say "I'm very happy here, please let me stay!"

When we got home and I managed to extract its claws - which I have to say, for such a small bird, were quite sharp - I thought I'd try to give it some water off my finger but to no avail so I filled a bowl with leaves and grass and popped it in and kept an eye on it. After about ten minutes it began to flap its wings in the bowl, looked around, and decided it was probably time to move on which it did very successfully by landing on a shrub next to my bird bath.

A few hours later a little collection of blue tits turned up at the bird bath which they do most days and maybe it was my imagination but in amongst them I'm quite sure I saw my

coal tit - they're not that common and are easy to recognise so I very much hope he will become one of the regular visitors to the bath.

To end. Being brought up on a farm in Ayrshire I hope Robert Burns would have understood and approved of the little bird rescue ........ as for the supermarket story he wouldn't have had the faintest idea what I was talking about!


