Letter From Avening Parish Council Leader



Avening Parish Council

One big talking point at this month's Parish Meeting was the very tawdry manner in which our comments on planning applications are dismissed by the CDC Planning Committee. It has come to the point that it seems a complete waste of time in submitting our views and opinions; the system now undermines and completely devalues our responsibilities as local guardians of Avening. We will of course continue to act for, and voice the concerns of the Village, in respect of local planning applications; but be aware that CDC no longer take Parish Council comments into consideration.

In future; if there are any applications you feel need to be restrained or cancelled, I strongly suggest that you write to the CDC Planning Committee; and either attend the CDC Planning meeting, or view the meeting online to get a full understanding of their rationale.

Tetbury Hill Parking

The traffic chaos caused by numerous parked cars has been raised by a number of villagers. This is a tricky problem; when there is a long continuous line of parked vehicles, it does become difficult to maintain an easy flow of traffic, particularly uphill towards Tetbury. I don't believe there is an obvious solution to this situation, other than to ask anyone who parks on the hill to try to ensure that there are gaps for passing vehicles to pull into.

Coronation 6th May & Avening Village Celebrations Sunday 7th May

Following a meeting held last week; Councillor John Hetterley has stepped into the role of village co-ordinator for this event. Elsewhere in this magazine you will see a poster giving the timings of each of the planned events.

John is being ably supported by a team of volunteers who will act as 'champions' for each section of the day. The day's events will start with the Church service which ends at 11.00am. This will be followed by everyone meeting in the sports field by 11.45am ready for 12.00 noon, for a parade down to the Memorial Hall, under the guidance of George and Elizabeth Buchanan; where everyone can enjoy their own picnics.

The W.I. will be providing some refreshments to accompany your picnics. There will be various music to enjoy – The Silver Band, Avening Singers and a number of village musicians yet to be confirmed. Mel Young will be the compere for this section of the day and no doubt will treat us to a rendition or two of her own.

The plan is for the picnics to continue until around 3.00pm - but it is hoped that everyone will feel motivated to return to the Playing field by 1.45pm, ready to take part in, or watch, the Sports events that will commence at 2.15pm. The Sports are being organised by Crichton Wakelin and Julie Bowden and will feature traditional

village sports.

The Sunground and Lawrence Road

Work has now commenced and is scheduled to be ongoing for about 54 weeks. (I can't believe it will take that long!). Please remember to be extra vigilant in keeping children and pets away from this building site. The developers have promised to sweep Lawrence Road regularly to minimise the disruption.

Pig Face Day

This traditional celebration is scheduled to take place in September and I hear that some enterprising plans are taking shape behind the scenes – more on this later in the year.

Hedgehogs & Hedgehog Highways

A worthwhile repeat of last months' entry; as they come out of hibernation Hedgehogs will look to travel across our gardens (eating slugs as they go). Travel can be made easy for them by the provision of small exits in the bottom of your fences. Later in the year the Parish Council will revisit the possibility of sourcing nesting boxes closer to their hibernation in the Autumn.



the pupils; an Easter egg hunt in the school garden and our Easter service in the Memorial Hall.



With around one month to go before the election, a couple of recent events make me even more determined to help make policy and process improvements at CDC. A planning application for a barn conversion was approved at the top of Woodstock Lane in the AONB despite over 30 objections – I managed to get a good hearing at planning committee, but due to ineffective CDC Local Plan policies, and some ineffective processes it was approved. Some of the key statutory consultees, such as Highways didn't even bother to respond, and I am following this up with GCC as this is clearly unacceptable.

Our stream is in a perilous state, and I have been chasing the Environment Agency for an update on the retrospective application for the new lake at Aston Farm. I also have a new lead on who are the main abstractors from the underground water systems, which I think is probably the main cause of our lack of water — I'll report back soon.

I mention these two LOCAL issues really to emphasise that I care passionately about our area, and where processes let us down I will work tirelessly to get them fixed. So even if blue isn't your usual party of choice, rest assured that the Cotswold Conservative group are all of a like mind, so please do make the effort to get out on 4th May (don't forget your photo ID), and I'd love you to vote for me!

Queen Matilda's Diary (Part 3)

Matilda died in 1083 and is buried in the Abbey aux Dames in Caen, France. Years later her tomb was desecrated, but her remains were placed in a sealed box and reburied. Her skeleton proved that she was in fact five feet tall, which was the average height in those days. William died four years later. Matilda's French is now interspersed with Latin, so the translation may be pure guesswork in places.

Well, it's been a good life and our children have done really well: it was a shame when our eldest Robert rebelled against his father, nearly killing him in battle. William was furious when he found out that I was sending money to Robert, and I still worry about them. Truth to tell, William's not looking too good now either, and has given up conquering. He's thinking of having a Domesday Book produced listing all the land

holdings in England, it's good that it will give him something rather than fighting to focus on.

I've had another church built too, in a village called Avening in England. It's a very attractive little village, but a bit cold and dark in winter, when they spend all their evenings in the many ale houses to save on heating Yes, the church was another their homes. penance: apparently that wretch Brihtric died in prison not long after I'd had him incarcerated and there was a huge fuss. Apparently there still is a play going around the country called 'Hell hath no fury like a Queen scorned', and William thought it was so funny he refused to stop it.

The villagers regularly celebrate the existence of their church with a feast which they call Pig Face Day. I hope that it's nothing to do with that old rumour that I have a face like a pig... why can't they call it Queen Matilda's Feast, I'd Queen Matilda's tomb in the Abbey like that? It would be nice if they would name one of their ale houses after me too, so they wouldn't forget me in years to come.
