Very often it is the case that there seems to be little by way of new exciting newsworthy events; with exception of the upcoming Coronation, this month has been very much in that vein.

Annual Parish Meeting – Wednesday 31st May 2023, 7.00pm

This will be in the Memorial Hall; it is a statuary requirement to have a public meeting for the Village to bring to the attention of the Parish Council any matters they may wish to raise.

The members of the Parish Council have been re-elected by way of it being an uncontested election as there were less candidates than the number of positions available; and so the picture stays the same. However, we will be looking to fill one vacancy, which was caused by the sad passing of our colleague Craig Forster late last year. If you are interested in serving the village on the Parish Council, then please contact myself or the Parish Clerk to register your interest.

Parking & Potholes

Parking on both the High Street and Tetbury Hill continues to be chaotic at times, making passing difficult. So if you are one of the villagers who need to park please try and leave some gaps where passing cars can pull in to help the flow of traffic.

Potholes continue to be the constant threat to drivers and after the recent rains they seem to have multiplied. Very often it appears that underground springs have found a new outlet in or near the roads. We will continue to put pressure on the Highways department to carry out repairs; it's always helpful if villagers can report new potholes on the Highways website as and when spotted; this will help to speed up repairs.

Coronation 6th May & Avening Village Celebrations Sunday 7th May

Whilst the Parish Council are sponsoring the event; it is heavily reliant on the volunteers who have stepped forward to organise the celebrations under the chairmanship of John Hetterley. The sports events are being organised by Crichton Wakelin, Julie Bowden and Kat Donovan. The parade will be supervised by George and Elizabeth Buchanan; whilst Mel Young, having already produced the posters, will be providing additional music to that provided by the Silver Band and the Avening Singers. Sandra Hetterley and Christine Howell will be working with the Avening W.I. and the Tuesday Café who will be providing refreshments to accompany your picnics. Cas Boddam-Whetham will be the First Aider. Special thanks to Derrick Ind for making the Social Club available for the committee meetings.

More volunteers are welcome – please contact John if you are available to help – 07729637411

Just to remind you -The plan is for the picnics to continue until around 3.00pm - but it is hoped that everyone will feel motivated to return to the Playing field by 1.45pm, ready to take part in, or watch, the Sports events that will commence at 2.

Avening Stream

We are still investigating the possible reasons why the water flow was so severely restricted last year and beyond. Tony Slater has been on the case since inception and is determined to solve the mystery. Under the Freedom of Information Act Tony has tried to get records from Wessex Water covering the water extraction that has taken place in our area. For example, there have been 800 new houses in Tetbury and we fear that water has been taken from our 'patch'. Wessex Water should have records covering at least the last 5 years – however the response has been that such information is not available to the public, and we will need to have a licence to obtain it. We will try to obtain one and get the necessary information. Similarly, we are pursuing the Environment Agency for answers on the Impoundment Licence covering the illegal damming and stream alterations that took place at Ashton Farm. Ashton Farm or Mr Philips should have responded to the notice by last January but no reply has been received. We will continue to pressure the Agency for answers.

Memorial Hall & Avening Primary School

We are making every effort to facilitate a smooth transition for the school into the Athelstan Trust; whereby they can enjoy continued use of the hall and its facilities. We wish them well in their new status. At the time of writing we are in active negotiations with the Trust solicitors with the aim of drafting a new lease asap.

Just a last reminder about the local elections – you will need some form of identification.



Spending Time in the Outdoors


Avening Playgroup

Local Elections: Thursday 4th May Important Information for all residents You will need valid ID to vote at polling stations on May 4th 2023.

As part of new laws introduced by Government, everyone voting in person at a polling station at this year's local elections on 4 May will need to show a valid form of ID to be able to vote. Find out more on the Cotswold District Council website including what ID is accepted and how to **apply for free ID** if you don't have one of the accepted forms of ID.

Visit www.cotswold.gov.uk/voterid.

Everyone who needs to apply for ID has until the 25 April 2023 to do so.

Voting By Post: The ID requirements will not affect postal votes so if you want to vote by post you can also find out how to do that on the Cotswold District Council website.

The deadline to apply for postal votes is 25 April 2023.

Proxy Voters: Proxy Voters will be required to show their own valid ID when voting on behalf of someone else.

David Lowsley-Williams

Many people in the village will have visited Chavenage House, situated halfway between Avening and Tetbury, where they will have been treated to a tour of that magnificent building hosted by its late owner, David Lowsley-Williams. Here we print the family's tribute to David, published on the Chavenage House website.

COMMUNITY TRANSPORT 'LIFELINE' FOR COTSWOLDS' ISOLATED AND RURAL PASSENGERS IS EXPANDING

A service that provides transport to older and vulnerable passengers in the Cotswolds, including those in rural areas, is making more than 12,000 passenger journeys annually – and is now expanding further.

Cotswold Friends' Community Transport Service takes people to healthcare and medical appointments, on practical journeys like shopping trips, and social trips like visits to see friends and family.

Over 1,700 members use the charity's service, which covers the North Cotswolds and Cirencester, and it is now expanding into the Fairford and Lechlade area to provide transport for social and practical journeys.

Over 400 members currently use the service in Cirencester and its surrounding villages.

The demand for the service, which is open to anyone who is not able to drive or finds public transport difficult to use, is growing rapidly and Cotswold Friends needs more drivers.

The charity also has a Wheelchair Accessible Vehicle, Weston, which can be booked through its Community Transport Service in the usual way and is available to passengers living in the North Cotswolds. Weston can carry one person seated in a wheelchair plus three additional passengers. It also has an adapted front passenger seat that swivels, making access easier. If you know anyone that could make use of Weston, perhaps for a social trip out with friends and family or for medical and practical appointments, please let them know about this service.




Empty Pill Blister Pack Recycling




