### October 2023

Many villages in the Cotswolds, and indeed, throughout the country, have their own special traditions, but none other than Avening have a 'Pig Face Day'; it is truly unique. It is wonderful that this event appears to have been celebrated on and off for the best part of 1,000 years - and the 2023 festivities on Sunday 17th September continued this tradition. There was a service in the church, the procession of the Pigs Head in the village and entertainment and pork sandwiches (plus veggie option) in the Memorial Hall. It may not have been as raucous as some previous ones - apparently, in the 1930s, buses from as far away as Swindon used to line the High Street, with revellers spilling out of the several pubs then in the village clutching their free brawn sandwich and pints of beer - but it was probably the first to include a specially written play, performed by children from Avening School. There are plenty of photos in the centre spread, while elsewhere in the magazine Roger Linley, who wrote the play and was the chief Pig Face Day co-ordinator, explains how he set about organising the event.

Events like these are what make living in a village fun and it is wonderful that so many people are prepared to participate in them. There is plenty going on in these villages, with something of interest for a range of ages and interests. Long may it continue!

There is not Parish Council Chairman's report this month as Patrick has been in hospital. We wish him a speedy recovery.

# **District Councillor's Report**



One of the lovely aspects to this role is being able to bring people together. In travelling around the ward, I make lots of contacts, and because my details are publicly available, people come to me as well. In the last few weeks, I have been able to match an existing Parish Clerk with a vacancy in another parish, which has benefitted both parties. In a more unusual case, a domestic parrot had escaped and was found after several days 'on the run' – I was contacted by the finder and was able to facilitate a happy ending with 'Alfie' safely returned home.

At CDC: The leader confirmed that CDC was currently in a good financial position, but in the coming years difficult decisions would mean some non-statutory services would change and some would cease, to avoid problems recently seen in Birmingham. Despite receiving a petition signed by more than 1,000 people, initiated by the opposition group of councillors, the majority group voted to uphold their decision to stop grants to Visitor Information Centres in the CDC area. Some will be able to adapt to finding alternative income sources, but some will inevitably close. This will save a rather modest £54,000.

Also relating to tourism, a review is being commissioned into public toilets. A report will be presented to the Overview & Scrutiny group into locations and usage, and I have volunteered to lead a piece of work on the future of these assets. My aim is to ensure the Cotswolds retain and improve these essential facilities.

A motion was presented on how to improve water saving measures in new build houses – this was unanimously approved, but I suggested it should be made even stronger.

Issues within the planning department have been confirmed, especially in the Enforcement team – a new officer has recently been appointed to help, but there are several vacancies.

There is a photo competition running until mid-October to showcase the beauty and variety of the Cotswolds – see the CDC website or Facebook for details.

**Banking in Tetbury**: In a previous update you may recall that I formally approached Link with a view to establishing a banking hub in Tetbury. Following their thorough review, they responded 'the current level of access to cash provision being assessed as being suitable for the community and therefore a new solution is not considered to be necessary in this location'.

**Avening & Cherington:** I attended my first PC meeting in Cherington as ward councillor and was made most welcome. Councillors highlighted some erroneous road markings around the Cherington Forge area, which (amongst several other suggested improvements in the district) I will pick up with Highways when I meet with them.

Avening PC meetings often clash with CDC meetings meaning that I partially or

completely miss many of these. The PC have resolved to move their meetings to the second Wednesday in the month SO that I am able to attend. The police and planning officers have been asked to visit the site manager of the Playgroup area development again due to parking issues caused by contractors.

The issue of constantly barking dogs has been raised to me by several residents, especially when owners let their pets out at night, or when left alone for long periods. Please take steps to minimise disturbance to neighbours.



Out in the orchard old Nobby is grazing, But he whickers a welcome and comes to our call. We slip on a halter, a leg-up from Vera. And I'm astride his broad back, with no fear of a fall! I ride to the yard where the milk float stands ready, We brush Nobby down, buckle harness and rein, Then climb on the float, up to the high seat, "Walk on old Nobby" and we're off down the lane! Nobby trots on to the start of the village Where Vera gets down, leaves the reins in MY hands! And as Vera delivers the milk to each household, I call "walk on Nobby, 'cos I'm in command!" Of course wise old Nobby knows just what he's doing, Knows the whole round, every stop, every start, But I sit on the high seat, surveying my kingdom, Fondly believing I'm driving the cart! Then when we come to the edge of the village, Vera climbs up, but leaves ME with the reins!

This time I really am driving old Nobby,

As we trot home in style down the quiet country lanes.

Back at the farmyard Michael is waiting,

I relinquish the reins and jump down from my seat,

I run round to Nobby, to kiss his soft muzzle,

Give apple and carrot, a well-deserved treat.

We give him a drink, and a bucket of feed,

As Vera takes Nobby back down to the orchard,

Michael and I set off home up the road.

Reaching our house, our parents are waiting,

### **Community Pill Pack Collection**

With regret, the collection of used pill packs will cease from the end of October. The pharmacy chain which recycles these has become much stricter about bulk donations, insisting that only personal donations can be accepted for health and safety reasons.

If you are a visitor to Stroud or Cheltenham, you will be able to continue recycle personally at Superdrug (both in the respective High Streets) - only Superdrug branches which have a pharmacy offer this service and these are the only two branches locally which do.

The collection box outside Church Farm Barn will remain until the end of October and I'll ensure that all packs added will be recycled. In 2023 so far, an impressive 10kg has been saved from landfill or incineration, so thank you to all who have been adding to the collection.

Nigel Bowsher's going to do the photography, and Michael Metcalfe's agreed to carry the pig's head and lead a procession from the church to the hall, brilliant. With the Singers following to the tune of Scarborough Fair, and the congregation plus children in fancy dress, that's a useful link between the church and hall celebrations.

All good, I can relax: with this fantastic level of support it can only be a resounding success. The school will explain the origins of Pig Face Day, villagers will enjoy an inexpensive Sunday lunch, and our organisations and charities will benefit from the fund-raising. It will be such fun that if it rains, nobody will care!



A big welcome to all the children just starting at Avening Playgroup and also a big welcome back to those children returning to the setting for the autumn term. So far, this term we have been helping the children to settle in, Playgroup so that they can become familiar with the equipment and resources on offer to them. We are also encouraging them to follow the playgroup routine.



Before the summer holidays, we were informed that we have been granted some money by the Parish Council. This has been put towards some new resources for the



children. They have thoroughly enjoyed role play and story activities with the new castle and police station!

Our Chair, Krista, has been busy trying to recruit new parents for our committee. Avening Playgroup is a charity and as such it needs to have a committee of volunteers to run it. We are required, as part of the Charity Commission rules, to have a full committee with a chair, treasurer and secretary, including a certain

percentage of parents with children at the playgroup. Without this, the playgroup would not be able to open. The committee meets for approximately 1 ½ hours every







# **Cookery Corner**

### **Rumtopf**

October is a great month to kick off a Rumtopf, a delicious, boozy German fruit compote steeped in rum, to be enjoyed from Christmas onwards. The summer's ripe fruit along with oranges, clementines etc as they come into season can be added to the pot, along with sugar and additional dark rum when required, keeping the compote going for months on end.

The traditional Rumtopf is decorative ceramic like that shown on the right, but we have found that these can leak and a large Kilner jar (or similar, with closure) works just as well (if not better). Sterilise the container by washing in warm water



and heating it to about 105°C. The fruit should be in good condition without any mould and should be washed and allowed to dry first.

To a bottle of dark rum (traditional unflavoured), add 275g of sugar per 500g of added fruit. Stir the mix but don't worry if the sugar doesn't immediately dissolve, it will eventually. All the fruit should be covered by the liquid.

Nearly all types of fruit can be added but we have found from experience that the following work well: clementines/satsumas (peeled, whole or segmented), strawberries/raspberries (hulled), seedless grapes (these become very strongly flavoured), other berries, apple/pear (peeled, cored and sliced), cherries (stoned), apricots (dried or fresh, stoned), plums (stoned and slices), peaches (stoned, sliced) and walnuts. We recently experimented with tinned pineapple (drained) which was delicious and you could try adding a cinnamon stick or two or star anise (optional). Banana is not recommended.

Leave the jar in a dark(ish) cupboard for at least two—three months (if you are adding to the original mix, try to avoid taking fruit that hasn't been in the liquid for this amount of time). Enjoy with ice cream, cream, pancakes or whatever you like.




