Letter from Chairman of Avening Parish Council



Summer has passed and the onset of autumn is with us and with it the evenings begin to draw in – always a surprise to me that it appears to happen so rapidly, and with it, a rush to get all the garden jobs done intime for winter.

During our 'Summer recess' the Avening parish councillors took the opportunity to go through and slim down the paper records that have accumulated over the past fifty years. It was a slow, dusty and arduous task. It involved reading each and every page to ensure nothing of real interest was confined to the waste bin. Interestingly, or maybe not, we came across a Chairman's report from over 20 years ago which highlighted some local issues as follows – Pot Holes in the roads, Dog Fouling on pavements and Playing Field, Litter and some Vandalism around the village – seems that life in the village of Avening hasn't changed much over the decades! (**N.B.** Anyone who fails to clean up after their dog can be issued with a fixed penalty notice of up to £100. If the case goes to court this could be increased to up to £1,000. The law states that being unaware a dog has fouled or not having a suitable bag is not a reasonable excuse.)

On the positive side, it threw up a few interesting items that seem to have been recovered for posterity.

Most notable amongst the 'treasures' found was a framed certificate celebrating the sponsorship by Avening Village of a boat during WW2 – called HMS The Grayling. Officially known as an ASW Trawler of the fish class, ten of which were built and all named after various fishes. This was a mine layer/sweeper – officially classed as a Corncrake type minelayer, built in 1940-1943; top speed 12.95 mph or 11.25 knots. Length 161.6ft and armed with 1 x 12 pounder gun, 3 x Oerlikon 20 mm AA guns and 40 x Depth Charges. Skippered by Walter Aaron George RNR 24 June 1942–2 Nov 1942, Lawrence Ford RNR 2 Nov 1942-20 Jan 1943, and Harold Edward Burman RNR 20 Jan 1943–mid 1945. The boat was sold in 1946. The framed certificate will now find a rightful place on the walls of the Memorial Hall.

Playing Field – A couple of the tables in the playing field had been damaged; this was mainly as a result of them being moved around the field as opposed to an intended act of vandalism – please treat them with care and return them to their original places after use.

The zip wire has been repaired and is sliding as well as ever – you're never too old to have a go!

The Memorial Hall – Work on the reroofing and refurbishment to the toilet area has been completed and now offers a more pleasant experience for the users of the hall. Similarly, the external door to the Chamberlain room has bee replaced as the old door was showing signs of rot. The Trustees will be now focusing on the planned refurbishment of the Chamberlain room kitchen. We would welcome input from the various users as to what amenities they would have on their wish list. It is worth mentioning again, that due to its charitable status the Memorial Hall cannot take out loans or mortgages to finance costs, and therefore has to be self-sufficient, or rely on donations or grants for additional financial help. All donations gratefully received.

New Parish Councillor Needed – We still have a vacancy for a new Parish Councillor – if you have an interest in joining, then please come along to the next parish meeting and sit in to observe what's involved. It's a relaxed environment and free from any form of press-ganging tactics to join.

Apple Pressing – This will take place again this year outside the memorial Hall on 12th October, so please bring along your apples

District Councillor's Report



CDC: At the Overview & Scrutiny meeting we were apprised of the government targets for building new homes. You may recall that following years of failed policies by successive governments, the new Labour government has made a big policy statement to build millions of houses, and in the Cotswold district the requirement has effectively been trebled to 1,000 per year, which, put into context is the equivalent of 2 Avenings every year! With these arbitrary targets, there has been no account of need in the district, the lack of infrastructure, the impact on the protected countryside, nor the unsustainability of expanding rural settlements. There has been insufficient time to adequately plan for the building, and it is contradictory to both the NPPF (National Planning Framework), and the new Local Plan. The burden is falling disproportionately on rural districts, when urban targets have actually been reduced despite these areas being more sustainable with better transport, infrastructure and facilities. As well as the lack of suitable areas for building, no thought seems to have been given to the financing of the builds (most district and councils don't have the financial capacity); who will build them (it is unlikely to be current volume builders due to the likely low profit margins on social houses, and councils don't have the expertise or staff); who will physically build them (there is a lack of skilled trades already); and how will the necessary infrastructure be provided. The council is preparing a robust response following a very short consultation period, which isn't about 'NIMBYism', but just the sheer impracticality of the demand. I'll keep you apprised of progress.

Bins: There are still some teething issues with the new rounds, which were exacerbated by a recent bout of sickness - the service has improved but is not yet at the required standard. However, most of the repeated missed collections are being closely managed, and as the crews get used to the new rounds the problems should disappear. Incidentally, the budget for the implementation was exceeded by around £70,000.

Crime: There are ongoing outbreaks of theft in our area, so please look out for anything suspicious and check your security is as good as it can be.

Roads: I was invited to view the A419 'missing link' construction works in August, which were very impressive! During the tour we were given the background to the work, and told how the project has won multiple awards for groundbreaking environmental its protection. For example, ecologists collected of adders, many the slowworms, and even protected snails to rehome them prior to the work starting.

The bulk of the road is being cut up to 16m below the surface to reduce the impact of noise and light, and there will be a 27m 'nature bridge' across the new road reserved for

wildlife and a new public footpath. No material is being taken away from the site, but is being reused elsewhere, including building 7.5km of new Cotswold drystone walls. The construction is on track to complete by early 2027, but the bulk of the road will be operational in 2026. Keep an eye on the National Highways webpage for more information.

Other updates and information for Parish Councils: PLANNING

Just a reminder to Parish Councillors to keep an eye on new planning applications. It is important to notify the planning officer within 28 days if it is felt that there are strong material planning considerations as to why an application should be brought before the committee. Please contact me with the details, I will speak to the planning officer and then I need to submit a pro forma indicating your concerns. This is quite different to how it was before April this year, when we all had the benefit of the consultee responses and the officer's report.

COTSWOLD CROWDFUND

Cotswold District Council has launched the Autumn funding round of its crowdfunding initiative. From cycle hubs to cricket clubs, playgrounds to street murals, if you have an idea for a project, you can make it happen with Crowdfund Cotswold. Residents know best what is needed in their neighbourhoods and have the skills and creativity to shape their local area and the future they want. Crowdfund Cotswold provides a springboard for locally-led ideas to attract funding more easily. Since its launch in 2021, Crowdfund Cotswold has supported local projects worth over £1 million. And now you can pitch for up to £10,000 from the Council to help fund your local community project. The deadline for the current round of funding for the scheme is fast approaching on 16 October. If you have ideas about a project in your community or want to learn more about the Crowdfund Cotswold initiative ahead of the funding deadline you can sign up to the Council's workshop. Letter to the Editors


Dear Editors,
