# Letter from Chairman of Avening Parish Council



Already I've heard Christmas music being played in a few retail outlets — surely too early and personally I think it detracts from Christmas being a special time of the year when we are constantly bombarded with reminders so many months beforehand — others will have their own view, especially the retailers!

So, what's happening in Avening? Well, sticking to the pre-Christmas theme we will have the switching on of the **Avening Christmas tree lights on 1**<sup>st</sup> **December, 5.30pm** (ish) – everyone welcome. Our very own Avening Singers will be there to lead us with a selection of Christmas carols. Afterwards it is hoped that those who can, will process down to the pub to continue the merriment and sooth any dry vocal cords.

Christmas Fayre Craft Sale, Friday 13<sup>th</sup> December, Avening Memorial Hall, 2.45pm – 6pm – There will be Santa's grotto, Raffle and Tombola, Festive Refreshments, Market Stalls, Christmas Crafts, Games & Prizes, Face Painting, Singing and Music. Put it on your Christmas bucket list!

Remembrance Sunday – Sunday 10<sup>th</sup> November. There have been many villagers from Avening and Nags Head who have given their lives in the Two World Wars and other conflicts, and it is proper to give our due respect to them, reflected in a well-attended service. Last year the Tetbury Air Cadets attended and provided their gravitas to the service; we hope that they can attend again this year.

The Village Stream – A reminder to all households whose property adjoins the stream that they have an inherent responsibility to maintain their portion of the stream by ensuring that it has not become restricted either by sediment or vegetation. If you are unsure about what's required, please look on line under Riparian rights. A Riparian owner is somebody who has either a main river or an ordinary watercourse, such as a stream or culvert, running through, beneath or adjacent to the boundary of their land. Where the watercourse forms the boundary of the land, you will usually own up to its centre. However, the rights of a riparian owner does not necessarily depend on ownership of the soil under the watercourse but may arise simply through ownership of land abutting the watercourse. So, to put it simply – if your garden adjoins a watercourse, make sure it is kept reasonably clean and clear.

**Avening Memorial Hall** – The Trustees and Parish Council are planning the next stage of repairs required for the roof. The overall cost could be in the region of £100k – so if you have any significant 'loose change' in your piggy bank that you would like to donate – please contact the Parish Clerk or any of the Parish Councillors. We are of course trying every available avenue of grants, but often grants are only available if significant funds are already in place, so every penny counts.

**The Orchard** – A big thank you to all those who attended the recent bramble and general weed clearing of the orchard; ably organised and lead by Phoebe Carter. A second 'hit' is planned for some time in February – pop it in your diary and come along.

**Snow Clearing and Grit Supplies** – If the volume of rain we are experiencing should fall as snow, then we will have big problems; lets hope we can avoid such extremes through the winter months. It is important to point out that the current grit bins will not be replenished during the winter (Council Cutbacks) and we must use the existing grit sparingly. The most efficient method for clearing the side roads/hills is by using the village gritter – this is stored in the small shed adjacent to the Memorial Hall.

# **District Councillor's Report**



**Cotswold District Council:** There was nothing too contentious at the September meeting other than questioning the resilience of CDC infrastructure. A storm caused a leak in the recently renovated roof which took out several IT and electrical services, leading to reduced service availability throughout the building. We are assured that the core systems were unaffected and that offsite backups are in place.

Following the full council meeting we attended an event at the Corinium Museum to celebrate 50 years since CDC was founded. We were joined by special guests, including past councillors and officers.

**Unsung Heroes**: The Unsung Heroes Awards is to acknowledge all the work being done across the district by volunteers who give up their time to help others. Residents and businesses have nominated people in their communities who they think have made a difference, from individuals who give up their time to help neighbours, to members of local groups who volunteer to deliver local projects. I was delighted to see that one of our Kingscote residents, Brian McTear, was an award winner in the first ceremony at the Full Council meeting on 25 September. This will be a rolling scheme with winners announced at every Full Council meeting going forward. Please nominate your Unsung Hero here: www.cotswold.gov.uk/unsungheroes

**Bins:** There have been ongoing issues with the new bin collection routes, especially in rural areas, and a written response to a question from Mike Evamy (The Cabinet member responsible) states: The waste team is committed to reviewing and improving the reporting processes following the recent round re-organisation. This review will include an evaluation of the entire online process, from residents reporting missed collections to crews addressing the issue, ensuring it is effective and allows residents to accurately report missed containers. The review will also look into the messages residents receive when reporting missed collections. This will include issues like 'gate checks,' where crews may indicate bins weren't placed out for collection or were contaminated, which currently prevents residents from logging missed bins. Key stakeholders, including customer services and the digital team, will be involved in the review, and extensive user testing will be conducted to ensure the tool is accessible and easy to use.

**Roads:** There have been several fatalities recently on our roads, mostly involving motor cyclists. With the darker nights and winter weather coming fast, do take care when travelling around the district.

**Gloucestershire County Council**: Cllr Mark Hawthorne recently stepped down as leader of GCC. He was 14 years as leader and a true champion for Gloucestershire both locally and nationally, which had helped the county punch above its weight. Cllr Stephen Davies has been elected as the new Leader.

#### Other updates and information for Parish Councils:

**Another parking survey:** Views on parking in Cotswolds sought for a second time from residents Cotswold residents are invited to give their views for a second time this year on parking in the district as Cotswold District Council launches its second consultation on current parking provision.

The first consultation ran in January 2024 and helped establish baseline data for how the public uses and perceives our parking provision. The second consultation, which begins in September 2024 will consider the changes in parking behaviour in the summer when tourism and summer holidays are at their peak, through to autumn when schools and colleges restart. Since the Parking Strategy was adopted 2016 several factors have influenced transport and parking behaviours, such as the climate agenda, the Coronavirus pandemic, the cost-of-living crisis and the wider economy. Cllr Paul Hodgkinson, Cabinet Member for Health, Leisure and Parking said, "We are delivering a second consultation so that we can get a holistic view of parking across the year. We appreciate parking demand fluctuates with the seasons, and a second consultation will provide us with a robust set of data to work with. 



# **Avening WI**

In support of the WI campaign Clean Rivers for People and Wildlife, all WI's were asked to take part in the Great UK WaterBlitz over one weekend in September. Having fashioned a testing device from a milk carton and a cane Liz, Gwyn and Helen tested the stream in Avening and again in Nailsworth (beyond the sewage works), for Nitrates and Phosphates. They uploaded the results on the FreshWaterWatch website. This showed:

'Your dataset indicates that this waterbody has a good ecological status. Moderately elevated nitrate concentrations. These values are expected to vary throughout the year as a result of weather patterns and changes in land use.' This was the same for both samples; a good result as it showed that the sewage works was not discharging any harmful substances. Samples were also sent off to Imperial College for their research. We have signed up again to take part in the Spring 2025 tests. If you are interested to see a map of the results across the country it can be found at


