As I write, I'm yawning after a late night of **Scottish dancing in Holy Cross Church in Avening**. The church came alive on a crisp October night – flickering torches lighting the churchyard, live music ringing through the nave, and the ancient stones echoing with laughter and dancing feet. It was one of those evenings when you could almost feel the history of the building come to life as the sacred space was filled with the sounds of life and community.

Now November arrives – a month that invites us to hold many things together. We begin with **All Souls**, that gentle, sacred time of remembrance when we speak aloud the names of those we love but see no longer. Candlelight softens the darkness; silence holds our gratitude and our grief. It is one of the most tender moments of the church year – a reminder that love endures, and that every life is gathered into the heart of God.

From that stillness, the month gradually brightens with creativity and anticipation. Later in November, **Amberley's Art4Life Exhibition** (21–23 November) will fill the church with colour and imagination – a celebration of local talent and the beauty of community. At the same time, **Stroud's Festival of Wonder** will be offering music, storytelling, and surprises across the town. I'll be there for part of the weekend as a chaplain, keeping an eye out for those moments when the sacred shimmers through the ordinary.

And then, before we know it, the scent of mince pies and the sound of carols will begin to appear on the horizon. I'll end the month with two **Christmas dinners in one week** – not quite *Vicar of Dibley*, but nearly! It's all part of that wonderful, slightly chaotic turning of the seasons, as we move from remembrance into joyful expectation.

November invites us not to rush, but to notice: the warmth of a shared meal, the glow of a candle, the steady rhythm of gratitude. In both memory and hope, God is with us – in laughter, in art, in quiet prayer, and even in a good reel danced beneath the ancient beams of Holy Cross.

District Councillor's Report



Cotswold District Council (CDC): Not a great deal to share this month from the full council, but there is a developing story following a report submitted to the Audit and Governance Committee relating to procurement of contracts without following due process. If this escalates, I'll send an additional report.

I attended a meeting with the **Planning Enforcement** team, who appear to be going in the right direction to improve service delivery. I raised the issue that I've had no information on cases raised, which has contributed to unwanted developments being built because cases were not pursued. The team acknowledged this as an issue that needs improvement but noted that there are sometimes legal reasons why updates cannot be provided.

Local Government Reorganisation (LGR) Gloucestershire's devolution process is estimated to cost £3.6 million for the period up to the submission of the county's preferred devolution plan in November 2025, which local councils are seeking government funding to cover. It has been reported that the devolution of Gloucestershire councils could eventually run to around £30m. The government believes the simpler unitary structure will be more cost effective to run and lead to better outcomes for residents and improved local accountability. However, from a district and parish council point of view, it will mean that contact and decision making is moved further away from residents.

The September **Overview and Scrutiny Committee** (O&S) asked that consideration be given to putting local social and/or archaeological artefacts on public display at the Council's offices, including artefacts related to the history of local government in the area. The Council's Leisure and Culture Manager will explore with the Museum operator, Freedom Leisure, opportunities to improve public access to the Museum's extensive collection.

Around the district: Congratulations to Didmarton on reaching 50 years of publishing their parish magazine, known as Dyddi Digest. This achievement was celebrated on the local BBC news, and I am grateful to the editors for including my small contributions. Avening have just successfully completed the re-roofing of their Memorial Hall – a mammoth and expensive project which will secure the hall for many years to come. Elsewhere, the outcome of the planning application to convert the Queen Matilda pub into a private residence will be announced soon. Beverston are closer than they have ever been to securing a realistic speed limit and traffic calming measures through the village, with all parties working together to move the scheme forward. Residents of Leighterton have been suffering at the hands of a developer who has strayed from agreed plans, and caused issues with uncontrolled dust. I have been liaising with the CDC Enforcement Team to ensure they are on the case. I have supported several parishes in registering recreational areas as dedicated 'Green Spaces', which will offer greater protection against speculative developments.

Letter from Chairman of Avening Parish Council



It looks and feels like winter is just around the corner, but we still have a few weeks left to enjoy natures autumnal decorations still on the trees and those leaves already sprinkled around the village. On the news front, it has been a quiet period, Parish Council meetings have resumed after a brief summer break and its back to business as usual; the details of which are shown elsewhere in this magazine, so I won't duplicate them here.

The Memorial Hall: At last, we have got over the finishing line with the completion of the two roofs on the Memorial Hall. Both the main hall and the Chamberlain room are safe from the threat of rain dripping on our heads. The next priority will be to refurbish the Chamberlain room and kitchen, and to decorate both areas.

One future project that the Hall Trustees are looking into is the viability of installing solar panels on the south facing side of the main roof and possibly on the flat roof over the Chamberlain room and kitchen. We are in the process of obtaining several quotations and will look at all the factors involved before making a firm decision. In principle, it would propel a building which is over a hundred years old into the realms of technology which is both environmentally and economically prudent. The south side of the main roof is not visible from the High Street and therefore it avoids detracting from the intrinsic character of our village.

We would welcome comments from villagers who may have strong opinions either for or against the fitting of solar panels in this manner. In the first instance please direct them to the Avening Parish Clerk.

A few reminders of items I highlighted in last month's Villager: -

Playing Field: Signs will soon be in place to alert users that surveillance cameras are in situ. The aim is to ensure the field is a safe, clean and respected village amenity.

Applications for Grants: The Parish Council will start the budget process in November. If your organisation wishes to apply for a Parish Council grant, please submit an application form before 1st November. Application forms can be downloaded from the Parish Council website or by contacting the Clerk.

Hedge Cutting: Please make every effort to cut back any overgrown vegetation that is overhanging public footpaths or roads. It can be difficult to navigate paths safely when the vegetation is in the way; especially true as the daylight gets shorter and it darker evenings draw in.

Longfield Calls for Volunteers for Their Christmas Tree Campaign

Longfield Hospice is already talking about Christmas and calling for volunteers to help with their highly successful green 'Christmas Treecycling Campaign'.

Avening Playgroup

Over the last few weeks, we have been looking at:

Autumn – collecting lots of conkers, leaves and pine cones, and used these to make autumn soup, creatures, crowns and wreaths. The children have been busy making hedgehog and owl collages, which we have put on our display. They have been rolling conkers in paint, printing with apples and pears, counting leaves and conkers, then matching them to numbers.



Diwali – We have been talking about how Diwali is celebrated across the world. The children have made mehndi patterns on paper hands and rangoli drawings. They have also made some chocolate truffles to take home.

Halloween—We got very messy digging the seeds out the pumpkin and printed pumpkins using some apples. The children also drew pumpkin faces, spiders and made pumpkin collages. They enjoyed decorating biscuits in a Halloween theme and learnt some Halloween songs.


